# Reflection for the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter from Caroline Poultney

Recently I had a short unforeseen stay in hospital; it was a scary episode because it took me and my family back to the time 18 months ago when I was far more seriously ill, and once again I gave myself over to the expertise of our medical services to prevent the possibility of worsening health. The stability of my family's daily life changed instantly: no longer was I wishfully 'in control' of events as we tried to manage this new anxiety and to keep closest friends and family informed without worrying them unduly. My work commitments were hastily shelved; I was no longer 'in control' in my business environment either and I had to let go and trust in all the help that was offered.

In a practical sense submission to medical resources and minds infinitely superior to my own was essential. Without any question we applaud the NHS: for their systems, their procedures, their medicines, their research – but mostly for their people. From the '111' telephone service to the GP, and then to the hospital with its teams of doctors, nurses, laboratory workers, administrators, cleaners, porters, caterers and more: they all showed such kindness and compassion to me in my time of weakness.

'Care' is a simple four-letter word, but its significance is huge. I thank anyone who works in our health system for my care, and for the care of the many other people who I came across during my brief stay in hospital. But there is more to 'care' than physical repair and maintenance. We can find strength in weakness, within ourselves, and in others. In John 17:6-19, one of this Sunday's lectionary readings, Jesus prays for his disciples that they may be kept safe by the name of Jesus as they are sent into the world. My friends, family and colleagues prayed for my safety; and I too spent much time in prayer and in reading from the Bible. These are some examples of where I found myself in my reading:

- Psalm 41:1 "Blessed are those who have regard for the weak; the Lord delivers them in times of trouble." A reminder of so many people who are employed in care services whose dedication and loving kindness is a reflection of Christ's own ministry to the sick.
- The Book of Job which inspires unwavering faith in God through immense suffering. How much more are other people currently suffering than I with my own relatively trivial health scare.
- The Book of Ruth demonstrating courage, service, and love of others before oneself.
- Finally 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my prayer is made perfect in weakness."

As well as being able to return home to recuperate I was able to reflect on that theme of finding strength in weakness, for this is where we find God's care. God's care works through others, and I pray God's blessing on all who minister healing and care whether in hospital, at home, or in the workplace, and on all those who receive it.

My closing words are from Psalm 27:13-14 "I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord."

May God's grace strengthen us all, protect us, and keep us safe, in the name of Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.
