Palm Sunday's annual procession, with or without a donkey, is a widely practised custom. We sing God's praises as we walk – 'All glory praise and honour to you redeemer king'. But this Sunday, gatherings and processions, religious or otherwise, remain forbidden. It still is Palm Sunday but not as we know it. However, that doesn't prevent us observing this significant day when Jesus went into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Matthew's Gospel chapter 21 tells us there was 'a very large crowd' and the 'city was stirred'. The people asked, 'Who is this?'

Mission Statement: "To know Christ better and to make Christ better known"

At the start of Holy Week, as we journey with Jesus to the place of crucifixion and resurrection, it is a question for us to ponder again.

'Who is Jesus?' and who is he for me this Palm Sunday and in a time of national emergency?

MMUK Prayer request – MMUK is very worried about the situation in Melanesia regarding COVID-19. Church services still took place on Sunday, and there is no clear government advice at present. Social distancing is not working as people evacuate Honiara in overcrowded boats, as instructed by the Government. There are no ventilators in the Solomon Islands, and suspected cases have their swabs sent to Australia for testing. At present there are no confirmed cases in the Solomon Islands or Vanuatu, but with such a widespread region, this may not give a clear indication of the situation. The Melanesian Brothers are worried about civil unrest, due to ethnic tensions, the large Chinese community and food shortages. We have one UK ordinand on placement with the Brothers stuck out there at present, all our gap year volunteers made it back to the UK. I am Tweeting all these concerns and prayer requests as we receive them. We are waiting to hear what plans the church is making and will look at how we can support them, in due course. Please pray for our Brothers and Sisters in Melanesia. Katie Drew.

Letter from the vicar

Hello everyone! Hope you're all surviving lockdown week 2. This epidemic continues to affect us all in so many ways – divorce rates around the country will probably soar, but think of the benefits to climate change of having no planes, cars or buses!

No doubt the longest lasting consequences will be on the economies of businesses small and large - local and multinational, including the government's finances...... and of churches!!

Which is the main reason for this article, as having no church services – and no fundraising events – is going to take its toll on our church finances, as many income streams have dried up.

These include plate offerings and white envelopes, shop income, coffee after church and Coffee and Chat – believe it or not, these give us at least £1200 a month – and that doesn't take into account any fees income from weddings and funerals, or the £7000 surplus from our now-cancelled Summer Fair.

If you are a giver and you are used to putting white envelopes, yellow envelopes, cash, or cheques in the plate on a Sunday, please don't put your giving on furlough – don't stop giving! There are other ways to give, and we really count on your financial help to be able to rise to the financial challenges the lockdown presents us with. The other ways to give are as follows, starting with the best (simplest and most efficient and convenient for us all) and ending with the somewhat less favourable to us (e.g. we pay a % transaction fee for donations by mobile phone). But, to be honest, any giving, done any way, is most welcome!

- 1. Join the Parish Giving Scheme (please request an application form from Treasurer Phil Whitlock 01404 814840)
- 2. set up a regular standing order from your bank account to the church account (details below)
- 3. pay by BACS (bank transfer) to the church account (details, again, are below) especially easy if you manage your bank account online
- give via our donations page on the church website (https://www.otterystmary.org.uk/donations) - you can choose to do this via PayPal, debit or credit card; and can select a one-off or monthly payment
- 5. give by text message, using your mobile phone (it IS possible but this route is maybe more familiar to our younger members!) instructions how to do this also via https://www.otterystmary.org.uk/donations

If any of you, however you give, would like to give additional help with the bailout (let's face it, we're not going to get any money from the Government!) and would like to make a one-off donation, we would be very grateful.
